



Hoyland Springwood Primary School Sports Premium Development Plan 2020 – 2021



Introduction

At Hoyland Springwood Primary, we recognise the contribution of PE and sports to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the behaviour, concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

What is the Sports Premium?

The funding is provided directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school receives £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The DfE has advised possible uses of the funding to include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits

Objectives

- To increase pupil participation in sporting events and activities
- To improve pupil health and wellbeing through engagement in sports and fitness activities
- To provide opportunities for talented pupils to develop

Utilisation of the Funding by the school

For the academic year 2020-21, we have received funding of £17,150. This money is to be utilised in the ongoing initiatives from previous years which have proved very successful:
