School trips – it has felt to parents like only trips at the end of the year	The school always aims to have school trips throughout the year with 1 every term. This year, this has been the case with the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, pantomime, Manor Park, Cannon Hall etc But I can understand concern as there have been 2 opportunities for school trips this half term for some of our classes. This happened as we were lucky enough to secure free tickets to the Ewden Water Works meaning only a minimal cost for travel for parents. Trips are expensive for school and for parents and we will always endeavor to only book
